The 59th All India Adult Education Conference planned to be held at Bhubaneswar from December 16-18, 2011 was postponed at the last minute due to unavoidable reasons.

Research and Studies

■ IAEA conducted a study titled "Situational Analysis of Parent Teachers Association (PTAs) in MCD aided schools in North West district of Delhi (Rohini)" assigned by Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR) and the final report was submitted on April 18, 2011.

- Two studies have been assigned by IAEA under Dr. Mohan Sinha Mehta Fellowship to Dr. Saroj Garg, Assistant Professor, LMTT College, Dabok, Udaipur (Title: A Study on the Identification of Factors Influencing Education of Tribal Girls in Udaipur district) and Education and Development Research Centre (EDRC), Pune (Title: Jan Shikshan Sansthan as an Institution of Excellence in the area of Vocational Education). The final report was submitted by Dr. Saroj Garg in April 2011 and EDRC in September 2011.
- IAEA has been given assignment by NLMA in June 2011 to compile the "Achievements of the National Literacy Mission Authority since 1988" for which a sum of Rs.10.70 lakh has been approved and Rs. 5.40 lakh released as first instalment.

Legal Literacy Camps

The National Commission for Women (NCW) sanctioned five Legal Literacy Camps to IAEA to be conducted at Jhadol (Phalasia), Jhadol (Sarada), Salumver,

Mavali and Rajsamund in Udaipur district in collaboration with the Directorate of Jan Shikshan and Extension Programme of JRN Vidyapeeth University, Udaipur.

Out of five camps, two have already been conducted - one at Salumver (October 13-14, 2011) and another one at Jhadol (October 19-20, 2011). The topics covered in these camps were Fundamental Rights, Domestic Violence and Law, Law regarding Payment of Maintenance Allowance for



woman in case of separation from the husband and Legal Provisions at the time of Arrest and Search.

Evaluation



paper on "Teaching Reading through Film Songs" based on the interim findings of a pilot project "Developing Low Cost Alternatives to Teaching Pronunciation".

Dr. Merlene Mercado Alon, Vice Chair of the Reading Association of Philippines (RAP) and Chair (2011-12), International Development in Asia Committee (IDAC) visited the India office of the RAI on October 19, 2011 and interacted with Delhi based members of RAI, specially the current and the past Presidents, Professor S. Y. Shah and Shri K. C. Choudhary, Dr. V. Mohankumar, Secretary of RAI and the Director of IAEA, eminent educationists and academic staff of IAEA. Among those present were Dr. Rajesh, Dr. J. P. Dubey, Dr. V. K. Dixit and Research Scholars from the Department of Adult Continuing Education and



Extension, Delhi University. The discussion was centered on the current literacy scenario in India and importance of promoting literacy and reading habits among adults and children and the various strategies adopted by the Government of India and universities and NGOs. In this context Dr. Mereline shared her experience in Philippines. Dr. Merlene was presented a set of publications brought out by Indian Adult Education Association and International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education.

A one day meeting of the Reading Association of India (East Zone) was organized by Prof. Asoke Bhattacharya, Coordinator, Eastern Zone, RAI at Abanindra Sabhagriha in the premises of Kolkata Information centre, Govt. of West Bengal on October 22, 2011. Prof. Alok K. Banerjee in his presidential address he spoke in detail about the importance of reading and desired the Reading Association of India to play a key role in the promotion of reading in India.Dr. Merlene Mercado Alon, Chair, International Development in Asia Committee and past President of the Reading Association of Philippines gave a detailed presentation on the activities of the International Reading Association. After Ms. Priyanka Sen and Ms. Runu Ghosh rendered Rabindra Sangeet, the meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Shri Sujit Kr. Datta.

• An experimental research project on Teaching Reading through Film Songs has been taken up as the first initiative of the Reading Association of India in collaboration with the World Literacy of Canada in September 2011. The project is of six months duration and supported by the International Reading Association through IAEA. It is implemented in two urban slums of Varanasi - a backward district in Eastern India. The main aim of the project is to test the efficacy of subtitled film songs in promoting reading specially the correct pronunciation of words and in the process motivating the learners to attend the classes regularly.

The sample comprised of 40 selected students of grade two of non formal education centers and an equal number of adult learners of literacy centers, For the purpose of research, the sample is divided into four groups comprising of two groups of 20 adult learners and two groups of 20 children. The sample is selected from a village population comprising of more or less same socio economic status. While one group of adult learners and children are treated as controlled group and taught in a traditional manner, the other group of adults and children are designated as experimental and taught using film songs with subtitles. In a session of two contact hours, the first half an hour is devoted to screening three selected Hindi film songs with the same language subtitles. The songs are played thrice. While the learners listened to songs in the first round, during the second and third rounds they join in singing. Three common words selected from the film songs by the learners are then drilled further by the teacher with the help of replaying the video with a view to teaching their correct pronunciation. Since the learners have the freedom to select the words, it gives them a sense of involvement in the learning process. The meanings of the words are also taught.

The screening of the popular Hindi film songs created a recreational and relaxed atmosphere in the class and motivated the learners to attend the classes regularly and in this process they learn the correct pronunciation of words with ease. In this action research project conducted over the first phase of three months (60 days), the experimental group recorded 95% attendance compared to 40% in the controlled group. While 90% of learners in the experimental group could pronounce all the 180 selected words correctly, in the controlled group only 35% succeeded in the pronunciation test. As against 80% who

succeeded in giving the correct meanings of the selected words in the experimental group, only 30% could succeed in the controlled group. There found to be only a marginal difference between the performance level of children and adults. Since the film songs with subtitles are telecast by the national television in several languages in India and can be freely used for educational purposes, this experiment can be replicated as a low cost or probably no cost innovation for motivating the learners to attend classes regularly and learn correct pronunciation which to a great extent may aid in facilitating reading. The only cost being for the purchase of a television set, DVD player and CDs which may be already available in some schools.


