

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to the General Body meeting of the Indian Adult Education Association and place before you the Annual Report of the year 2012. Like previous years, the year 2012 also is an action-packed year for the Association. We have undertaken a number of programmes and activities and also extended cooperation wherever possible for the National Literacy Mission Authority, State Resource Centres, Jan Shikshan Sansthans, NGOs and University Departments of Adult, Continuing Education and Extension/Lifelong Learning. Before I could enumerate the activities conducted I would like to state that the massive programme of adult education in our country "Saakshar Bharat" which was launched in September 2009 has made a good progress and achieved the desirable results in the last three years. Till date the programme is implemented in 372 districts spread over 25 states and one Union Territory. Literacy centres have been opened in all the Panchayats and around 17 million learners have been enrolled. The learner's assessment in literacy centres is conducted by National Institute of Open Schooling twice in a year, i.e. in the month of March and August. So far the number of learners appeared in assessment was 20.18 million out of which 14.64 million successful learners have been certified.

Apart from the basic literacy conducted in the literacy centres, around one million Adult Education Centres have also been opened which act as Continuing Education Centres. The National Institute of Open Schooling in consultation with the National Literacy Mission Authority and State Literacy Mission Authorities is developing detailed guidelines for equivalency programmes while the Jan Shikshan Sansthans organize skill development programmes. Following is the details of the annual report:

Compilation of NLM Achievements

IAEA has got an assignment from the National Literacy Mission Authority to compile the achievements of National Literacy Mission since 1988. The compilation titled as "Two Decades of National Literacy Mission – Some Prospectives" has been completed and submitted to the Director General, NLMA on October 1, 2012. The process of preparing this document started with a one day consultation meeting at India International Centre, New Delhi on December 28, 2011 in which 19 invitees participated. The valuable suggestions given by the participants were that articles need to reflect not



only the achievements of the mission but also the failures so that it becomes a good reference material for the future generation. It was also suggested that the contents of the articles should not only record the history but also the events in a chronological manner. Thereafter, the identified writers have been given specific titles.

The first draft reports received from the authors in the month of May 2012 were referred to independent reviewer for comments/observations. Then the draft reports were discussed in a one day meeting held at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi on June 13, 2012 in which 25 invited persons participated. A number of suggestions came from the participants for improving the quality and content of the articles.

The final draft was placed before the expert group of persons on September 18, 2012 in which a few more suggestions came from the participants which were duly incorporated in the articles.





Legal Literacy Camps

Two Legal Literacy Camps sanctioned by National Commission for Women (NCW) organized at Teacher's Training College, Delwara Rajasmand on December 16-17, 2011 and at Teacher's Training College, Jhadol (Phalasia) on January 12-13, 2012 in collaboration with Jan Shikshan Evam Vistar Karyakram Nideshalaya, JRN Rajasthan Vidyapeeth, Udaipur, Rajasthan.

In these camps the subjects covered were Violence Against Women, Domestic Violence, Procedure to file FIR at Police Station, Governmental Programmes for Empowering Women, Importance of SHG and Micro Credit Facilities, Right to Information, Legal Aid Societies and their Role in Assisting Women and MGNREGA.





Training Programmes

Capacity Building Training for the functionaries of JSS Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh

A two day Capacity Building Training for the functionaries of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh was planned and organized by Indian Adult Education Association on January 23-24, 2012 in the office of the Sansthan. Dr. V. Mohankumar, Director and Shri B. Sanjay, Assistant Editor, Indian Adult Education Association acted as Resource Persons. After opening remarks by Director, JSS and introduction of participants and resource persons the



academic sessions started immediately. The first session was Ice Breaking which was followed by three academic sessions out of which two were on Interpersonal Relationship and Communication by Dr. V. Mohankumar and Programme Planning by Shri B. Sanjay.

On the second day the first short session was devoted to review of previous day's session which was followed by four academic sessions. The topics were History of Adult Education in India, Saakshar Bharat and Role of JSS in Saakshar Bharat taken by Dr. V. Mohankumar and Monitoring and Evaluation by Shri B. Sanjay.

In the concluding session all the participants were given an opportunity to express their frank opinion on the academic

sessions with regard to content and delivery which became the evaluation of the training programme.

The methods adopted by the resource persons were lecture, discussion and question-answers sessions. Power Point Presentations were used in all the sessions and copies of the same distributed to all the trainees.

Capacity Building Training for the functionaries of JSS West Bengal




A two day Capacity Building Training for the programme functionaries of Jan Shikshan Sansthans located in the state of West Bengal was organized at Unnayan Sagar, New Digha, Purba Medinipur on February 8-9, 2012. In all 38 persons participated from eight Jan Shikshan Sansthans – Narendrapur, Bankura, Haldia-East Medinipur, Purulia, Jalpaiguri, West Medinipur, Howrah and North 24 Parganas.

The resource persons were Dr. V. Mohankumar, Director, Indian Adult Education

Association, New Delhi, Shri A. K. Pati, Former Director, Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Narendrapur and Dr. Seema Mukhopadhya, Programme Coordinator, State Resource Centre, West Bengal. After introduction of the participants and resource persons the academic sessions started immediately.







Dr. V. Mohankumar took three sessions - Programme Planning, Interpersonal Relations and Training Needs Assessment. Apart from this two practical exercises were also given. The method adopted was interactive due to which the participants actively involved in the discussion. Power Point Presentations were used in the sessions and copies of the same distributed to all the trainees.

Capacity Building Training for Literacy Personnel of Afghanistan

On behalf of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA)/Project on Improvement of Literacy Education Management in Afghanistan (LEAF2) IAEA

organized a 14 days Capacity Building Training to the Literacy Personnel of Afghanistan from October 8-21, 2012 at YMCA, New Delhi. The main objective of the training programme was to understand the background, status. challenges and opportunities of the literacy programmes in India with particular reference to Development of Curriculum, Assessment of Learning



Achievements, Reporting and Database and to develop Action Plan for improving Assessment of Learning Achievements, Reporting and Database in Afghanistan based on the lessons learnt.

In all 16 persons participated in the training out of which 12 were officials from Literacy Department, Ministry of Education, Government of Afghanistan (Mr. Ata Mohammad "Mohammadi", Manager, Planning Unit, Mr. Ahmad Zaki "Saame", Students & Graduated Students Affairs Unit, Mr. Hedayatullah"Hashimi", Distance Learning Unit, Mr. Janan" Mirkhil", Curriculum Unit, Mr. Mohammad Wahid, Monitoring and Evaluation Unit, Ms. Malalai "Ludin", Teacher Training Unit, Mr. Abdul Satar Mirza, Manager, Balkh Provincial Literacy Centre, Mr. Habibullah Satughani, Manager, Bamyan Provincial Literacy Centre, Mr. Moh. Akram Isaqzai, Manager, Nanagerhar Provincial Literacy Centre, Mr. Ihsanullah Musawi, Manager, Procedure (Admin), Mr. Najeebullah Hamdard, Teacher Training Unit, Mr. Shir Aqa Amin, Monitoring and Evaluation Unit.), 2 were National Members of JICA/LEAF2 Project (Mr. Fardeen "Tabesh" and Mr. Ziaulhaq "Jamal") and 2 others were Japanese experts of LEAF2 (Professor (Ms.) Yumiko Ono and Ms. Rie Koarai).

The academic sessions were planned to include all important aspects so that the participants not only gain knowledge but also able to practice some in their own area of operation. The Resource Persons/Subject Specialists were also selected keeping in view the topics chosen for the sessions. The methodology used in the training included lecture, question answer, discussion, group work and field visit. For the academic sessions the resource persons prepared Power Point Presentations to enable the participants to understand the subjects better.

As most of the participants were familiar in their local language, the Power Point Presentations were translated to Dari language by the language specialists in Kabul itself. In the sessions the deliberations in English were translated then and there in Dari language by National Members of JICA/LEAF 2 Project.

The inaugural session was presided over by Shri K.C. Choudhary, General Secretary, Indian Adult Education Association and the inaugural address was given by Professor S.Y. Shah, Group of Adult Education, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. Mr. Ata Mohammad Mohammadi, Manager, Planning Unit, Literacy Department, Government of Afghanistan and Ms. Rie Koarai, LEAF2 Japanese Expert addressed the participants. While Dr. V. Mohankumar, Director, Indian Adult Education Association gave the welcome address, Smt. Nishat Farooq, Vice President, Indian Adult Education Association gave vote of thanks. Dr. Madan Singh, Treasurer, Indian Adult Education Association was also present.

Evaluation

During the year of reporting IAEA conducted external evaluation of four Jan Shikshan Sansthans – Lakhimpur-Kheri (Uttar Pradesh), Gorakhpur (Uttar Pradesh), West Godavari (Andhra Pradesh), Malappuram (Kerala) and two State Resource Centres – Srinagar (Jammu & Kashmir) and Shimla (Himachal Pradesh).



JSS Lakhimpur-Kheri

The evaluation of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Lakhimpur-Kheri was conducted from

January 9-13, 2012 by a team of five evaluators – Dr. V. Mohankumar, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal Singh Mehara, Shri Jai Bhagwan and Shri Shiv Prasad. The period of evaluation was from 2007-08 to 2009-10. Data was collected from 8 Blocks by interviewing 150 exbeneficiaries, 37 resource persons, a few elected members of Panchayats and representatives of



collaborating agencies. The evaluators also visited 9 on-going vocational training centres for on the spot verification. The final report was submitted to Directorate of Adult Education in March 2012.

JSS Gorakhpur

The evaluation of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Gorakhpur was conducted from January 16-22, 2012 by a team of five evaluators – Dr. V. Mohankumar, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal



Singh Mehara, Shri Jai Bhagwan and Shri Shiv Prasad. The period of evaluation was from 2007-08 to 2009-10. Data was

collected from 7 Blocks by interviewing 150 ex-beneficiaries, 18 resource persons, a few elected members of Panchayats and representatives of collaborating agencies. The evaluators also visited 7 on-going vocational training centres for on the

spot verification. The final report was submitted to Directorate of Adult Education in March 2012.

JSS West Godavari

The evaluation of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, West Godavari was conducted from January 30 to February 3, 2012 by a team of six evaluators – Dr. V. Mohankumar, Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal Singh Mehara, Shri Jai





Bhagwan and Shri Shiv Prasad. The period

of evaluation was from 2007-08 to 2009-10. Data was collected from 13 Mandals by interviewing 150 exbeneficiaries, 27 resource persons, a few elected members of Panchayats and representatives of collaborating agencies. The evaluators also visited 5 on-going vocational training centres for on the spot verification. The final report was submitted to

Directorate of Adult Education in March 2012.

JSS Malappuram

The evaluation of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Malappuram was conducted from February 17-20, 2012 by a team of seven evaluators –

Dr. V. Mohankumar, Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal Singh Mehara, Shri Jai Bhagwan, Shri Shiv Prasad,

Shri Vinod Pathak and Shri Vinay Chhetri. The period of evaluation was from 2007-08 to 2009-10. Data was collected from 15 Blocks covering 43 centres by interviewing 150 ex-beneficiaries, 34 resource persons, a few elected members of Panchayats and representatives of collaborating agencies. The evaluators also visited 7 on-going vocational training centres for on the spot

verification. The final report was submitted to Directorate of Adult Education in March 2012.

SRC Srinagar

The evaluation of State Resource Centre, Srinagar was conducted from May 8-11, 2012 by a team of four evaluators – Dr. V. Mohankumar, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal Singh Mehara and Shri Jai Bhagwan. The evaluation was a qualitative study based on fourteen parameters divided into sub-parameters assessed through fifty indicators.

The evaluation team initially had a detailed discussion with the Director In-charge and Programme staff followed by collection of all relevant materials related to the parameters and subparameters. Separate discussion was held with the members of the Governing Body of SRC, writers, resource persons, representatives of a few organizations and field functionaries working in Pulwama, Baramulla, Bandipora, Badgaon, Ganderbal

and Anantnag districts to know about the quality and content of the programmes organized by SRC. During the field visit to Ganderbal district, the evaluators called on the Deputy Commissioner/District Development Commissioner to discuss about the academic support extended by SRC for adult education programmes. The evaluators also had a separate meeting with 14 Master Trainers in DIET, Ganderbal to discuss about the training programmes they have undergone in SRC.

The field visit also included meeting with the preraks and learners of two on-going centres at Chiak Kawasa and Kawoosa Khalisa villages in Badgaon district.

SRC Shimla

The evaluation of State Resource Centre, Srinagar was conducted from June 4-9, 2012 by a team of four evaluators – Dr. V. Mohankumar, Shri S.C.Dua, Shri Kripal Singh Mehara and Shri Jai Bhagwan. The evaluation was a qualitative study based on parameters given by the Directorate of Adult Education.

As part of evaluation the members of the evaluation team had discussion with the Director, members of the staff, Vice Chairman and Members of the Governing Body, Writers, Trainers, Resource Persons and Trainees apart from scrutiny of records, reports, documents and papers.

The evaluators also visited Chamba, the only district under











Saakshar Bharat in the state of Himachal Pradesh and also under the programme "Island of Excellence" of State Resource Centre. In the field the team had discussion with Additional Deputy Commissioner, District Coordinator and Secretary, Zilla Saksharta Samiti, Project Officer, Block Coordinators, Master Trainers and Zonal Resource Persons to understand the literacy programme being implemented in the district.

The field visit was to three centres in Salooni block located at Panchayat building in Singhadhar, Nodal Lok Shiksha Kendra in Kihar and Govt. Primary School, Juwaas in Sneh Gram Panchayat.

Outreach activities

As part of outreach activities vocational skill development training programmes are conducted for women and girls at Trilokpuri in Delhi East, one of the biggest resettlement colonies of Delhi. The Trilokpuri centre is in operation from February 2009. Like previous years two vocational training programmes – Cutting & Tailoring and Beauty Culture and Health Care were conducted during the reporting year also. Apart from skill development programmes, the trainees were given awareness on selected issues closely related to their day-to-day life and betterment of their social and economic status.

New Year Celebration

The trainees of both the batches of vocational trades jointly celebrated New Year on January 3, 2012 by organizing music, dance and fancy dress competition. As the trainees belonged to different states they have showcased the culture of their states of origin which everyone enjoyed. On this occasion one of the participants spoke about the value of teaching and the respect for the teacher which was appreciated by one and all.



As part of the celebration the successful candidates of vocational training programmes received their certificates from Shri S.C. Dua, Consultant, IAEA. Smt.

Kalpana Kaushik, Assistant Director, IAEA was also present.

Tests Conducted

As part of trainees' evaluation final tests (Practical and Theory) for the beneficiaries of Beauty Culture and Health Care (Sixth Batch) and Cutting & Tailoring (Fifth Batch) were conducted on February 27, 2012. In all 35 women girls appeared in the tests out of which 18 were for



Beauty Culture and Health Care and 17 for Cutting & Tailoring.

Again final tests were conducted for the Seventh Batch of beneficiaries of Beauty Culture and Health Care and Sixth Batch of

On this occasion 36 successful beneficiaries who have appeared in the final tests in the month of February-March 2012 received certificates from Smt. Kalpana Kaushik,

Assistant Director, IAEA. Shri Jai Bhagwan, Coordinator of the extension centre was also present.

Stree Shakti – Suvidha Kendra (GRC-SK)

IAEA has got a project Stree Shakti - Suvidha Kendra (GRC-SK) from the Government of NCT Delhi. The project aims to reduce poverty by women's access to their economic, social and cultural

rights and making them agents of change. The project functions on Public-Private

Community Partnership module and its special focus is on children and women living in urban slums of Delhi as 45% of population lives in slums, resettlement colonies and

unauthorized colonies and around one lakh live in streets of Delhi.

The GRC-SK of IAEA is located at Kirti Nagar

in Delhi North District to cover the slum clusters of Furniture Block, Chuna Bhatti, Jawahar Camp, Sanjay Camp, Mansarover Garden and Ramesh Nagar to serve for about 20,000 people. The

Chief functionary of the project is Shri K.C. Choudhary, General Secretary, IAEA and the team of other functionaries include Project Coordinator, Programme Officer, two

Community Mobilizers, SHG Mobilizer, Instructor for Non-formal Education and two Vocational Instructors.

The key focus area for GRC-SK is holistic community development with – social empowerment of women through counseling, camps and awareness generation, employability through vocational training and skills development, economic













and social empowerment through promotion and strengthening of Self-Help Groups and Micro Credit and Micro Finance Access, health awareness and health services, nutrition awareness, functional literacy through non-formal education, legal awareness, counselling and aid, rights awareness and political empowerment, advocacy, dissemination of information about facilities, services and resources available at GRC-SK and

facilitating access to welfare entitlements and development programmes of the government which are meant for weaker sections.

The first task given to GRC-SK of IAEA is to do door-to-door survey under Annashree Yojana to identify from the existing data available with the government the APL families, particularly vulnerable and most vulnerable categories, which are not getting subsidized ration to transfer Rs.600/- per month/per household through electronic transfer in the account of women who head the families. Identification has been done based on Aadhaar, Voter ID Cards and Ration Card. So far 218 Bank Accounts have been opened in Oriental Bank of Commerce and State Bank of India.

A Nutrition Camp was organized on November 20, 2012 at Sant Nirankari Satsang Sthal of Kirti Nagar Chuna Bhatti in which 35 women and 30 children have participated. Smt. Sunita Rani, Nutritionist not only spoke on nutritious and delicious food suitable for lactating mothers but also helped the participants to prepare 'Kheer' which at the end everyone tasted and appreciated.

The camp was organized by Ms. Komal, Programme Officer and Ms. Indu, Instructor, Non-formal Education with the active support of Shri Jai Bhagwan and Shri Vinod Pathak of IAEA.

The Kirti Nagar GRC-SK was visited by Shri K.C. Choudhary, General Secretary, IAEA and Chief Functionary of the project on November 23, 2012. During his visit he not only reviewed the programmes undertaken but also discussed with the project functionaries for quality and content improvement and increasing the pace of work.

Library Science Course

IAEA is an accredited institution of National Institute of Open Schooling to conduct certificate course in Library Science.

The fourth batch of 8 students who were admitted to the course in the year 2011



have appeared for Practical and Theory examination in the first week of May 2012 successfully completed the course.

In the year 2012 again 8 students have been admitted to the course and they will appear for the examination in the year 2013.

Library and Documentation Centre

The library of IAEA is devoted for reading materials on adult and

non-formal education and allied fields. It has a collection of more than 7500 books including journals, periodicals and magazines. It also has copies of external evaluation reports of Total Literacy Campaign, Post Literacy Programme, Continuing

Education, Jan Shikshan Sansthans and State Resource Centres conducted by evaluating agencies. These reports have a lot of information needed for research scholars and academicians.

During the year of reporting the following activities were conducted:

- One issue of Adult Education Index containing bibliographical citations of latest books, articles on caste census, youth, adult education, adult literacy, women, adolescence issues and issues concerning HIV/AIDS was printed and distributed.
