I have the privilege to welcome you all to the General Body meeting of the Indian Adult Education Association and place before you the Annual Report of the year 2015. The year 2015 also has been an eventful one as we have carried out a number of activities including publication of books and building maintenance in a big way, but limited to the funds available. When the year 2015 is coming to a close the management of the Association is marching forward with a great satisfaction of providing dynamic leadership to the organization following the footsteps of the founding fathers and try to the maximum to meet the basic objectives enunciated in the Memorandum of Association.

Before I could explain in detail about the programmes undertaken by the Association, I would like to brief you all about the Assessment of Basic Literacy Programme done by National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS).

Learner assessment is an important aspect of literacy programme. Initially the assessment was done mostly by the literacy educators (instructors/volunteers) by administering tests on reading and writing but no certificate was issued declaring the successful learners as neoliterates. As the learner assessment was treated as a routine one, the test papers were not kept safe for further reference which created a lot of information gap for the researchers in the field of adult education. Subsequently, under Improved Pace and Content of Learning (IPCL) the learner assessment test papers became an integral part of the three part primers. After each group of lessons, a test paper was given and every part of the primer had three test papers each. As and when the learners successfully complete each of the test papers they were given a certificate duly signed by the literacy

volunteer. In this way the successful learners completing nine tests (famously called T9) in three part primer became neo-literates with a certificate. However, as the certificate issued was not having the seal of a recognized organization or signature of the competent authority it did not carry any value. This credibility loss made the adult education programme implemented in this country with no brand value. Hence, when Saakshar Bharat came into existence in the year 2009 the policy document clearly stated that NIOS will be involved in a big way in the learner assessment tests. Hence, a formal assessment test of the basic literacy programme started in the year 2010.





The assessment tests are conducted twice in a year, i.e. in the month of August and March. So far 11 such tests have been conducted, the first being on August 20, 2010 and the last one on August 23, 2015. While the results of the last test are still being computed by NIOS, the achievement in the first 10 assessments is as under:

Some of the highlights of these tests are:

- The assessment and certification of neo-literates for basic literacy programme is a collaborative initiative of National Institute of Open Schooling and National Literacy Mission Authority.
- The assessment tests have been conducted without any gap twice in a year from 2010 onwards.
- Females have shown a lot of interest in not only appearing in the tests but also successfully completing the same in comparison to males.
- The assessment tests are not restricted only to the beneficiaries of Basic Literacy Programme organized under Saakshar Bharat but open to all who desire to sit for examination.
- The learner assessment is done through external summative written tests of three hours duration. On the appointed day the centres are open from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and the learners can come to the centres according to their own convenience and take the tests.
- The learner assessment is to ascertain the proficiency level attained by the learners in achieving literacy skills (3 Rs) and the empowerment experienced through participation in the programme assessment of literacy skills.
- The assessment is done by using the tools constructed as per the norms of National Literacy Mission.
- The tools are developed by NIOS in Hindi in collaboration with the State Resource Centres and translated in regional languages.
- The question-answer booklet has adequate space for writing answers. The learners do not use separate sheets.
- The total assessment is of 150 marks (50 marks allocated for each skill, i.e. reading, writing and numeracy).

- NIOS processes the results. Based on the marks obtained grades are given as below:
 - O 60% and above Grade A (Good)
 - O 40% and above Grade B (Satisfactory)
 - O Less than 40% Grade C (Needs improvement)
- Learners securing Grade C in any of the component can reappear in the subsequent assessment test to improve their level of competency.
- The unsuccessful candidates can reappear as many times as they require until they are eligible for certification.
- Grade Sheet-cum-Certificate is issued to the learners under the joint signature of NIOS and NLMA. Only grades are reflected in the certificate.

Learner assessment with the help of NIOS is a welcome step initiated by the National Literacy Mission Authority and everyone in the field of education, particularly in adult and lifelong education should appreciate.

Now I would like to give a detailed account of the programmes and activities conducted by the Association during the year 2015 which are as follows:

All India Adult Education Conference

The 61st All India Adult Education Conference is scheduled to be held at Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu from December 28-30, 2015 in collaboration with Gandhigram Rural Institute – Deemed University. The theme of the conference is "Lifelong Learning and Skill Development" and the sub-themes are - Vocational Skill Training for Women Empowerment, Skill Development Training for Youths, Importance of Skill Training in 'Make in India' Programme, Traditional Vocational Crafts - Need for Protection and Revival, Vocational Training in Unorganized Sector – Need for Standardization, National Skill Qualification Framework – A Step towards Quality Assurance, Vocational Skill Development Training and Economic Development and Vocational Education: Role of Institutions of Higher Learning.

Meeting of the Executive Committee

The meeting of the Executive Committee was held on 12.3.2015 at 11:00 a.m. in the office of the Association. In the august presence of Prof. B.S.Garg, Patron,

Shri K.C.Choudhary, President, IAEA presided over the meeting. The committee discussed and approved the agenda items including confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting held on 29.8.2014, approved the report of programmes and activities conducted during the period September 2014 to February 2015, budget for the year 2015-16 and Annual Report of the year 2014. The committee also condoled the death of Prof. B.B. Mohanty, Shri Rashbehari Acharya and Shri K.S. Anantha Subba Rao, Life Members.



The next meeting of the Executive Committee will be held on December 28, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. at Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu.

Meetings of Council and General Body of IAEA

The Council meeting of the Association will be held on December 29, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. and of the General Body on the same date at 9:30 a.m. at Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu.

Monitoring visits by Office Bearers

The Office Bearers of the Association closely monitored the work of the Association in person by making periodical visits. During such visits not only they have reviewed the work of individual staff members in the meetings but also the expenditure incurred and building maintenance carried out.

1. Prof.B.S.Garg, Patron addressed the members of the staff on 11.3.2015 in which he said that what Mahatma Gandhi propagated during independent struggle still holds good for the development of the country and human race. His advice for educating the common man is the basis for the education policies formulated in the independent India. According to him no country can progress with large chunk of unlettered people as they may not be able to exercise their franchise properly with the end result rarely proper persons are elected as policy makers.



He also said that a few institutions in the field of adult education and community development came-up because of his motivation and call and fortunately the Indian Adult Education Association is one such organization. Till date we are able to meet the basic objectives for which the institution was started and this trend should go in the years to come also.

On this occasion Shri K.C.Choudhary, President, Dr. M.S.Ranawat, Vice President and Dr. Madan Singh, General Secretary were also present.

2. Three Monthly Monitoring Meetings were held on 29.4.2015, 21.5.2015 and 17.6.2015 in which the members of the staff presented the plan of action and





work done before Shri K.C.Choudhary, President and Dr. Madan Singh, General Secretary. The work of each staff member was reviewed and suggestions for

improvement given.

The President and General Secretary gave a lot of importance for systematization of work and clean maintenance of office building.

3. On the eve of Diwali the members of the staff had a get together with Shri K.C.Choudhary, President and Dr. Madan Singh, General Secretary on November 5, 2015 in which five members of the staff who have completed 15 years of continuous service in the Association were honoured. They were Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Shri M.L.Sharma, Smt. Neha Gupta,



Shri Kripal Singh Mehara and Shri Kishore. They received Titan wrist watches as gift from the President.

4. On the directions of Shri K.C.Choudhary, President the Foundation Day of IAEA was observed in a fitting manner by the members of the staff on 2.12.2015.



Nehru and Tagore Literacy Awards

The Indian Adult Education Association instituted two literacy awards, one in the name of Jawaharlal Nehru started in the year 1968 to commemorate his distinguished services to the cause of reason of enlightenment and the other in the name of Rabindranath Tagore started in the year 1987 to commemorate the 125th Birth anniversary of the great poet. The awards are given to individuals and institutions in recognition of their outstanding work in the field of adult education/women's education. So far 43 have been given Nehru Literacy Award and 24 have got Tagore Literacy Award.

The awards carry a plaque, shawl, citation and cash of Rs.21,000/-.

Extension Work - Stree Shakti Suvidha Kendra, Kirti Nagar

As part of outreach activities the Indian Adult Education Association runs a Stree Shakti Suvidha Kendra (SSSK) at Kirti Nagar, North Delhi. This Kendra is famously called Gender Resource Centre (GRC) as it helps women to avail the benefits of welfare schemes of the government and also gets access to services and facilities under the Mission Convergence of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi including vocational training, health care, education and many more. This Kendra is financially supported by the Women and Child Welfare Department of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi. Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Deputy Director, IAEA is the Chief Functionary of this Kendra.

In the year 2015 SSSK, Kirti Nagar organized a number of activities which include food and nutrition camp, health camp, OPD clinic, legal awareness camp, water and sanitation training, water and sanitation awareness camp, Skill Training Programme and Dengue Awareness Camp. Details are as per the following:

• 10 food and nutrition camps were organized primarily for women at Sanjay Camp (12.1.2015), Fire Station Jhuggi (9.2.2015, 9.3.2015), 8/35 Kirti Nagar (28.4.2015, 12.10.2015), 5/35 Kirti Nagar (21.5.2015, 30.6.2015), Harijan

Camp (27.8.2015), Jawahar Camp (9.11.2015) and 5/35 Shiv Mandir (14.12.2015) in which the subject specialists gave talk on the need for nutritious food, particularly for pregnant, lactating women and growing children, menopause, anemia, balanced diet and the importance of vitamins and calcium for elderly people. Discussions were also held with women regarding the menstrual cycle (need for regularity and consultation with the doctor for irregular periods).



Apart from lecture and discussion the subject specialists prepared cost effective nutritious foods to demonstrate the participants to prepare such items at home so that they get adequate nutrition for the body.

• A health camp was held at Kamla Nehru Camp (29.1.2015) in which eye check-



up and eye care was conducted by Akil Bhartiya Bhakad Bhat Jan Kalyan Samiti. In all 351 persons have got benefited.

The camp was visited by Shri K.C.Choudhary, President accompanied by Dr. Pramila Agarwal, George Brown Community College, Toronto, Canada and Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Chief Functionary.

Out Patient Clinics (OPD) were held for 18 days at Kirti Nagar Basti Vikas Kendra

(13.2.2015,11.3.2015. 23.3.2015. 17.4.2015, 25.4.2015, 8.5.2015, 18.5.2015, 1.6.2015, 19.6.2015, 7.7.2015, 21.7.2015, 3.8.2015, 17.8.2015, 7.9.2015, 5.10.2015, 2.11.2015, 16.11.2015, 4.12.2015). This was done as part of bringing health care services to the door steps of the community people. In these clinics patients were not only treated for their diseases but also free medicines given. Those patients



who required specialist/institutional treatment were referred to big hospitals. The Doctors conducted counseling with patients on the seasonal and common diseases and also on preventive methods.

• 22 legal awareness camps were organized with the help of Delhi Legal Services



Authority and legal experts at Fire Station Jhuggi (Anganwadi Kendra) (24.3.2015, 31.3.2015), 5/35 Durga Mandir (13.1.2015), 5/35 Kirti Nagar (20.1.2015, 20.5.2015, 16.6.2015, 1.7.2015, 10.11.2015), Kamla Nehru Camp (13.2.2015, 6.5.2015, 15.5.2015 26.5.2015), Harijan Camp (18.2.2015, 1.4.2015, 19.8.2015), 10/67 Kirti Nagar (4.3.2015), Chuna Bhatti Budh Mandir

(16.4.2015), Basti Vikas Kendra, 52/53 Kirti Nagar (18.6.2015), Wadhwa Camp (29.7.2015, 2.9.2015, 2.12.2015) and 8/35 Kirti Nagar (4.11.2015) to create awareness on domestic violence, female feticide, dowry, sexual harassment, labour Act, laws governing the care of old people and government schemes available for them.

held at Chuna Bhatti Budh Mandir (28.1.2015, 21.2.2015), Wadhwa Camp Anganwadi Kendra (26.3.2015, 21.8.2015, 29.10.2015), GRC Campus (24.4.2015, 23.5.2015), 5/35 Kirti Nagar and Basti Vikas Kendra (23.6.2015, 30.7.2015, 31.8.2015) to group of people who in-turn organized awareness training programmes for the community people on water and sanitation. In these training programmes 'Sehat Ka Pegam' was used as a resource book.



• 16 water and sanitation awareness programmes were conducted at 10/67 Anganwadi Kendra (3.1.2015), Chuna Bhatti MCD School (6.2.2015), Chuna



Bhatti Anganwadi Kendra (6.6.2015, 29.7.2015), Budh Mandir Chuna Bhatti (26.2.2015), Sanjay Camp (4.4.2015, 2.5.2015), Wadhwa Camp(16.5.2015), Kamla Nehru Camp (20.6.2015, 3.7.2015, 8.12.2015), Harijan Camp (4.8.2015, 3.10.2015), 10/67 Kirti Nagar (4.9.2015), 8/35 Kirti Nagar (18.4.2015) and 5/35 Kirti Nagar (3.11.2015) in which the participants were given a lot of information regarding the importance of preserving water, water sources, personal hygiene and environmental cleanliness.

Two vocational skill training programmes were conducted in Basti Vikas Kendra in which 86 women and girls were benefited - 39 in Cutting & Tailoring course and 47 in Beauty Culture & Health Care course. The Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Peeragarhi conducted examination for both the courses on February 24-25, 2015 and successful beneficiaries were given certificates.



- In another vocational training programme organized at Basti Vikas Kendra the beneficiaries were given orientation on 15.5.2015 regarding the use of waste cloths and materials to prepare decorative items.
- A workshop on skill development was organized on 22.5.2015 for the beneficiaries of vocational courses on health. The objective of this programme was to make the vocational trainees 'Health Activists to Educate Women' so that they not only do social service in the community but also get employment opportunities to earn money. Shri Bhanu, Manager, Shraf Eye Hospital, New Delhi was the Trainer/Resource Person. Initially 15 women participated in counseling out of which 9 were selected for training based on their interest, enthusiasm and initiative.

Other activities in SSSK

 The first year students of M.A Lifelong Learning and Extension in the Department of Adult, Continuing Education and Extension, University of Delhi as part of their field orientation visited SSSK, Kirti Nagar on 19.1.2015. They were accompanied

by Shri Rahul Yadav, Assistant Professor. The students were shown Non-Formal Education Centre at Chuna Bhatti (Near Shiv Mandir, C-Block) where during interaction with the beneficiaries they spoke on Right to Information, Importance of Education and Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. The students also enacted a skit in the community at two places on the need for environmental cleanliness. The play was titled "Bhagwan Ki



Mahanarak Ki Yatra" which was enjoyed by one and all. A pamphlet in Hindi on the importance of 'cleanliness' was distributed in the community.

 World Water Day was observed on 23.3.2015 at four places – MCD School Chuna Bhatti, 5/35 Basti Vikas Kendra, Harijan Camp and Budh Mandir Chuna Bhatti in which around 329 people participated. The programme was divided into




different sessions in which group discussion was conducted, awareness rally taken, plays enacted, quiz programme organized and drawing & painting competition held. The programme was addressed by Shri Hari Om Sharma, President, Tasha Solution, Shri Gulshan Ranjan, Senior Manager, Aditya Bidla Group, Dr. Surjit Gupta, Gynecologist, Shri Hemant Singh, Project Coordinator and Shri Ramesh Kumar, Social worker.

 SSSK, Kirit Nagar facilitated enrollment of people for Aadhar Card at Samajik Suvidha Kendra by creating awareness through house to house visits in the month of March – April 2015. Around 244 people have enrolled in the same.



World Malaria Day was observed at Wadhwa Camp on





sessions, out of which two were devoted for lecture and the third one was for rally. In the two sessions talks were given by Md. Saleem, Malaria Eradication Officer, Delhi Municipal Corporation and Dr. Surjeet Gupta, Nutritionist spoke on causes, precautions and cure of Malaria. The children of Wadhwa Camp participated in the rally to create awareness among

the people on malaria. A play was also enacted by the Angawadi children.

• A mega camp was organized at Sant Nirankari Bhawan on 9.5.2015 in which more than 300 people enrolled for Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Evam Durghatna

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Beema Yojana. The functionaries of SSSK played an important role in motivating people to come to the camp.

• World Environment Day was observed on 5.6.2015 at Budh Mandir Harijan Camp, Kamla Nehru Camp and Wadhwa Camp in which 164 persons participated. As part of the celebration social activists spoke on the ill-effects of pollution and the need for saving the earth. A rally was also taken in which the community people, children, NFE students, functionaries and social activists participated.



• Independence Day was celebrated at Basti Vikas Kendra on 14.8.2015 in which all the functionaries, trainees of vocational courses and NFE students participated. On this occasion a cultural programme was also organized in which children and women performed dance, song and plays. The senior functionary addressed the audience on patriotism and the patriots of this country.

SSSK in association with the office of District Magistrate, West Delhi conducted



Dengue Awareness Campaign at 5/35 Chuna Bhatti, Hrijan Camp and Jawahar Camp from 21.9.2015 to 24.9.2015. Dr. Surjeet Gupta and Dr. Sunita were the resource persons who spoke on the causes of the disease and how to prevent. A rally was also conducted by the functionaries and the trainees of vocational courses. Nukkad Nataks were also conducted on this occasion.

• World Toilet Day was organized on 19.11.2015 at 5/35 Kirti Nagar, Wadha Camp and MCD School Chunna Bhatti in which around 350 people participated which included the functionaries, students of NFE, trainees of vocational courses and the local people. As part of the programme a rally was conducted to create awareness about the importance of toilet. A drawing competition was also organized for the students and three best drawings were selected for award.



Action Research (limited to conduct of Recce)

Indian Adult Education Association was given an assignment by the State Resource Centre, Lucknow to study the reasons for low literacy rate at Balrampur district and particularly Panchperwa Block. For this study a Recce was conducted at Lucknow and Balrmapur from 3.2.2015 to 5.2.2015 by Shri B.Sanjay, Research Officer and Shri Jai Bhagawan, Assistant. They have interacted with Shri Dinesh Babu Sharma, Director, Basic Education, Smt. Shashi Kiran Tripathi, Joint Director, Basic Education, Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and Shri Abhinav Sinha, Senior Professional

(MIS & Planning), Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, UP, Shri G. Pattanaik, IAS (Retd.), Chairman, SRC, Ms. Ramesh Sharma, Additional Project Director, SSA, UP, Shri Sant Ram Soni, Deputy Director, State Literacy Mission Authority, UP, social activist Shri Rama Shankar Upadhyaya, Shri Jai Singh, Basic Shisha Adhikari, Shri Sanjay Mishra, Chairman, Tarai Environment Awareness Samiti, Balrampur and Shri Udai Bhanu Yadav, Block Education Officer, Panchperwa Block.



The visit was facilitated by Dr. S.C.Upadhayaya, Shri Sudhakar Man Singh, Shri Om Prakash Chaurasia and Shri Anoop Krishna Srivastava of SRC by providing the needed information and data relating to the study.

The assignment could not be completed as SRC was advised by NLMA to undertake such studies by themselves using own resources to gain experience.

Panel Discussion on New Education Policy

A panel discussion was organized on 12.2.2015 (forenoon) in which Prof. N. K. Ambasht, former Chairman, National Institute of Open Schooling spoke on 'Making of New Education Policy'. He said that in 30 years i.e. from 1986 to 2015 the educational tools and technologies have changed a lot and the new gadgets almost reduced the necessity of writing skills to communicate with each

other. A person having no or less writing skills can communicate well with the help technology like mobile phones. With this improvement traditional concept imparting literacy needs relook. The new concept of eliteracy will almost minimize the actual classroom teaching by



adding virtual classroom and cloud classes even in the far and distant places. The e-literacy/e-learning will also help in shortening the learning period as it facilitates the fast learning persons to cross the bar and acquire knowledge with much more speed and less of time. He also opined that lifelong learning with the help of open learning system is going to be the order of the day in the years to come in which fiber optic technology will play a decisive role. Hence, it is imperative for the entire faculty to become techno savvy and work in tandem with the changing technology.

After the speech of Prof. Ambasht a number of people from the audience gave their opinion on the subject who included Dr. L.Mishra, Prof. Rajesh, Shri Prem Chand, Dr. Ajay Kumar, Smt. Nishat Farooq, Dr. M. V.Lakshmi Reddy, Dr. A.Mathew, Dr. Mandakini Pant and Dr. Pramila Agarwal.

In the beginning Shri K.C.Choudhary, President, IAEA and Chancellor, IIALE gave the

welcome address and Prof. S.Y. Shah, Director, IIALE introduced Dr. N. K. Ambasht to the audience. Dr. Madan Singh, General Secretary proposed the vote of thanks.

Panel Discussion on Women Empowerment

A panel discussion on "Women Empowerment" was organized on 12.2.2015 (Afternoon). The panelists were Dr. Pramila Agarwal, George Brown Community College, Toronto, Canada, Dr. Mandakini Pant, Freelance Researcher, Dr. Bani Bora, Senior Research Fellow, International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education (IIALE) and Shri B.Sanjay, Research Officer, IAEA.

Dr. Pramila Agarwal narrated her experience of working for the cause of empowerment of minority groups in Canada that included Chinese, African and Indian immigrants while Dr. Mandakini Pant gave a presentation on "The Pedagogy of Women Empowerment" which was based on the research studies conducted by her in the states of Uttarakhand, Kerala, Telengana and Rajasthan. Shri B.Sanjay in his presentation said that women empowerment includes two

important aspects – one understanding the empowerment and the other is understanding empowerment from the women's perspective. According to him empowerment comes only if women have the power to take decisions in the family and society and the decision making depends on access to information, options which help to make choices and capacity to make a person capable.

In the beginning Dr.V.Mohankumar, Director introduced the subject and panelists and at the end he also gave vote of thanks.

Brain Storming on the issues relating to senior citizens

In view of the growing concern about life of senior citizens who are many times uncared or less cared by their own children due to which they live under fear, care

of the old has become a hot topic in the social circles. A number of programmes are being implemented for the old people with the financial support of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Many NGOs also have programmes exclusively for the older people including running old age homes. This problem cannot be



solved individually either by the government or by a few NGOs but the larger society can do it. 
Publications of IAEA





The MoU was operationalised when six students of the Masters Programme in Lifelong Learning from the University of Delhi and three Doctoral Students from Jawaharlal Nehru University were selected to participate in the International Winter School on Comparative Studies on Adult and Lifelong Learning held at JMU from 27.1.2015 to 7.2.2015. The selection of students and their orientation was facilitated by IIALE in cooperation with the University of Delhi and JNU.

All the expenses of the students for travel, stay and health insurance for ten days workshop in Wurzburg were covered by DAAD scholarship provided by the German Government.

The Winter School provided an opportunity to the Indian students to meet their counterparts from eleven European universities and to attend 15 lecture sessions on various aspects of adult and lifelong learning delivered by eminent international scholars and also get a comparative perspective on developments in Asia and Europe.

The winter school was coordinated by Professor Dr. Regina Egetenmeyer of the Institute of Education, JMU who is also a Visiting Professor of IIALE.


