Dear friends,

I am pleased to present the Annual Report of the Year 2021 to the General Body. Before discussing the various programmes, activities and events carried out by our Association during the year, I would like to brief you about the recent developments in the field of National Education Policy (2020) with special reference to Adult Education.

As you may be aware, the Government of India has approved a **Centrally Sponsored Scheme**, namely, the “New India Literacy Programme (NILP)” for the next five years (2022-27) in order to integrate all aspects of adult education with the National Education Policy, 2020 (NEP).

The Education Ministry has adopted the term ‘Education for All’ in place of ‘Adult Education,’ to make it more inclusive of all age groups.

The objective of the scheme is not only imparting foundational literacy and numeracy but also covering other components which are necessary for a citizen of the 21st century such as critical life skills (including financial literacy, digital literacy, commercial skills, healthcare and awareness, child care and education, and family welfare; vocational skills development (with a view towards obtaining local employment); basic education (including preparatory, middle, and secondary stage equivalency); and continuing education (including engaging holistic adult education courses in arts, sciences, technology, culture, sports, and recreation) as well as other topics of interest or use to local learners.

The scheme will be implemented through volunteerism and online mode. The training, orientation and workshops of volunteers may be organized through face-to-face mode. All materials and resources shall be provided digitally for easy access to registered volunteers through easily accessible digital modes, viz, TV, radio, cell phone-based free/open-source Apps/portals, etc.

According to Census 2011, the absolute number of non-literates in the country in the 15 years and above age group is 25.76 crore (Males 9.08 crore, Females 16.68 crore). Taking into account the persons certified as literates being to the tune of 7.64 crore under the Saakshar Bharat programme implemented during 2009-10 to 2017-18, it is estimated that currently around 18.12 crore adults are still non-literate in India. However, the target for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy for the

period 2022-27 is 5 crore learners @ 1 crore per year by using “Online Teaching, Learning and Assessment System (OTLAS)” in collaboration with National Informatics Centre, NCERT and NIOS in which a learner may register him/herself with essential information like name, date of birth, gender, Aadhaar number, mobile number etc.

The estimated total outlay of “New India Literacy Programme” is Rs.1037.90 crore which includes Central share of Rs.700 crore and State share of Rs.337.90 crore respectively for the period 2022-27. Salient Features of the scheme are as follows:

1. Schools will be the unit for implementation of the scheme.
2. Schools to be used for surveying beneficiaries and Voluntary Teachers (VTs).
3. Different strategies are to be adopted for different age cohorts. Flexibility for States/UTs will be provided to undertake innovative activities.
4. Foundational Literacy and Numeracy will be imparted through Critical Life Skills to all non-literates aged 15 years and above.
5. Technologies will be used to impart Adult Education for wider coverage of the scheme.
6. Performance Grading Index (PGI) for State/UT and district level will show the performance of States and UTs to implement the scheme and achievements on yearly basis by weighing both physical and financial progress through the UDISE portal.
7. CSR/philanthropic support may be received for developing ICT support, providing volunteer support, opening facilitation centres for learners and for providing IT access to economically weak learners in the form of cell phones, etc.
8. The age cohort of 15-35 will be saturated first followed by ages 35 and above. Priority will be given in terms of categories to the girls and women, SC/ST/OBC/Minorities, Persons with Special Needs (Divyangjans), Marginalized/Nomadic/construction workers/labourers/etc. who can substantially and immediately benefit from Adult Education. In terms of location/area, the focus shall be on all aspirational districts of NITI Aayog like districts with literacy rates less than the National/State average, districts with female literacy rates less than 60% as per the 2011 Census, Districts/Blocks with large SC/ST/Minority population, Educationally Backward Blocks and Left wing extremism affected districts.
9. Convergence with various Ministries and Departments for effective implementation of NILP covering Digital Literacy, Financial Literacy, Skilling, Legal Literacy, Health and Hygiene literacy, Cultural Literacy with the involvement of Anganwadi workers, NCC Volunteers and Ex servicemen, NYKS, NSS, Cooperative Societies, Departments of Disaster Management, Minorities, Libraries especially in Rural and Tribal areas.
10. NILP as Janandolan:
 - Three crore students/children of around 7 lakh schools registered under

UDISE and about 50 lakh teachers of Government, Aided and Private schools will participate as volunteers.

- An estimate of 20 lakh students from Teacher Education and Higher Education Institutions will be actively involved as volunteers.
- Support will be garnered from PRIs, Anganwadi workers, ASHA workers and an estimated 50 lakh NYSK, NSS and NCC volunteers.
- There will be community involvement, participation of philanthropic/CSR organizations through volunteerism and Vidyanjali portal.
- States/UTs will promote individual/family/village/district success stories through various platforms.
- It will utilize all types of media – Electronic, Print, Folk & Interpersonal platforms including social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, WhatsApp, YouTube, TV channels, radio, etc.

11. Central Portal will be developed by NIC for aggregated data capturing equipped with Mobile App, Online Survey Module, Physical & Financial Modules and Monitoring Framework, etc.

12. Assessment of Literacy will be conducted using scientific format to capture the real-life learnings and skills for functional literacy. Assessment on demand will also be made through OTLAS and an e-certificate jointly e-signed by NIOS and NLMA will be issued to the learner.

13. Annual Achievement Survey of Learning Outcomes by samples of 500-1000 randomly selected learners from each State/UT and Outcome-Output Monitoring Framework (OOMF).

I. Programmes Planned and Organized by IAEA

(i) IAEA Staff Meeting

A staff meeting was convened on December 31, 2020 at the Headquarters of IAEA to welcome the newly elected President Dr. M.S. Ranawat and General Secretary Shri Suresh Khandelwal. The meeting was joined by all the staff members including outgoing President Shri K.C. Choudhary and General Secretary Dr. Madan Singh along with Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director. The meeting was presided over by Shri K.C.Choudhary in which both the newly elected President and General Secretary had a detailed discussion about the future course of action of the Association and the role to be played by the members of staff to achieve that. While addressing the staff Shri Choudhary meticulously underlined specific attributes and efficiency of almost all the staff members and appreciated the efforts made by each of them to continue office and complete essential tasks even during the lockdown days.



(ii) Brainstorming Meeting for Strengthening LLL Programmes in the Community



A brainstorming meeting was organized by the IAEA at its office on February 18, 2021 in order to assess the emerging needs of people living in the slums of Anna Nagar, identify the interventions needed for improving their quality of life and formulate a comprehensive project for “Strengthening Adult and Lifelong Learning Programmes in the Community”. The meeting was participated by Prof. S.Y.Shah and Prof. Rajesh, Vice Presidents, IAEA, Dr. Mridula Seth, Director, Life Skills Education Programme, SPYM Juvenile Drug de-addiction Centre, Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, Shri B. Sanjoy, Research Officer, IAEA and Dr. Bani Bora, Director, Centre for Social Change along with five Research Scholars from the University of Delhi – Ms. Parinita Batra, Shri Kumar Gaurav, Ms. Kiran Verma, Shri Vikas Kumar and Shri Alok Kumar.

The meeting was presided over by Shri K.C. Choudhary who wanted the participating scholars to develop an insight into the real time problems of the people living in slums

and less developed communities and also to learn teamwork as part of improving their professional competence. A concept note entitled “Strengthening Adult and Lifelong Learning Programmes in the Community” prepared by Dr. Mridula Seth was circulated amongst the participants to enrich their understanding of working for the welfare of the community. Thereafter, Prof. Shah and Prof. Rajesh described in brief the vision behind undertaking such programmes.

The meeting was concluded with the decision to conduct a survey in Anna Nagar to collect relevant data specifically to assess the level of education, skill acquisition and important health concerns of the families residing there so that the possible mode of intervention for improving their quality of life can be identified for the proposed project. The meeting was coordinated by Smt. Kalpana Kaushik.

(iii) International Women’s Day

IAEA launched a social outreach project to mark and celebrate International Women’s Day on 8th March 2021 in collaboration with the Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, University of Delhi. The programme was attended by Prof. S. Y. Shah and Prof. Rajesh, Vice Presidents and Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, IAEA. While launching the project Prof. S.Y.Shah said that the project has come-up as a part of the initiative for “Strengthening Adult and Lifelong Learning Programmes in the Community” and is being jointly undertaken by IAEA and DACEE, University of Delhi. On this occasion a group of 4 students - Shri Kumar Gaurav, Shri Vikas Kumar and Ms. Kiran Verma pursuing M. Phil and Ms. Parinita Batra doing M.A from the DACEE visited the slums of Anna Nagar and interacted with nearly 40 persons to solicit relevant information and create awareness about various developmental issues for improving their quality of life in a sustained manner.



(iv) Felicitation for Dr. L. Raja

Due to the sudden demise of Dr. M. S. Ranawat on April 10, 2021 Dr. L. Raja, one of the five elected Vice Presidents of IAEA was unanimously elected as the President of the Indian Adult Education Association, New Delhi who will occupy the post till 31.12.2024.

As the newly elected President of IAEA Prof. Raja, Professor and Head of the Department, Lifelong Learning & Extension, Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), Dindigul, Tamil Nadu was welcomed at the Headquarters of the Association on July 16, 2021 by the Members of Executive Committee including Shri K.C. Choudhary, Former President, Prof. S.Y. Shah, Vice President and Shri S.C. Khandelwal, General Secretary. He was also felicitated with a bouquet as mark of respect. The programme was followed by a brief discussion



with the staff members in which Prof. Raja emphasised that the Association should play a lead role in empowering the deprived and disadvantaged sections of the society.

(v) Conferment of Nehru and Tagore Literacy Awards

Prestigious Nehru and Tagore Literacy Awards for the year 2019 and 2020 was conferred by Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India in a grand ceremony organized by the Association on December 19, 2021 at Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Conference Hall, Vice President's House, New Delhi. At the very outset of the ceremony the hon'ble Vice President was formally received with a shawl and auspicious shreefal by Prof. L. Raja, President, Shri Suresh Khandelwal, General Secretary, Shri K.C. Choudhary, Former President and Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, IAEA. The ceremony began with the welcome address given by Prof. L. Raja who extended a warm welcome to the Vice President, Shri I.V. Subba Rao, Secretary to the Vice President, all the recipients of the literacy awards and dignitaries present on the occasion. Thanking the Vice President for conferring these awards Dr. Raja said that his gracious presence in the award ceremony would sensitize the whole nation to consolidate its effort for the furtherance of adult, continuing and extension education and to realize the cherished goal of universal education and a knowledge society. Thereafter, citations were read by Dr. V. Mohankumar and Smt. Kalpana Kaushik followed by the conferment of awards by the Vice President.

The Nehru Literacy Award for the year 2019 was conferred to Prof. P. Adinarayana Reddy, Former Director, Department of Adult and Continuing Education, Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati for the outstanding work done by him in the field of literacy, adult, continuing education and extension while Prof. M.C. Reddeppa Reddy, Department of Adult and Continuing Education, Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati received it for the year 2020 for his excellent contribution to the field of literacy, adult, continuing education and extension.





The Tagore Literacy Awards for the year 2019 was conferred to Prof. Anita Dighe, Former Director, Campus of Open Learning, University of Delhi and presently a Visiting Professor in the International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education, New Delhi for her outstanding contribution in the field of women's literacy, empowerment, lifelong learning and extension while Smt. Nishat Farooq, Former Director, State Resource Centre, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi received it for the year 2020 for her outstanding contribution to material development, training and evaluation in the field of adult and continuing education and extension.

Prof. P. Adinarayana Reddy, Prof. M.C. Reddeppa Reddy and Smt. Nishat Farooq personally received the plaque, shawl, citation and a cheque of Rs. 21,000/- as part of this coveted award from the hands of Hon'ble Vice President of India while Dr. Anita Priyadarshini received it for Prof. Anita Dighe who could not attend the ceremony in view of some unavoidable reasons.

Addressing the dignitaries present on the occasion Shri Naidu congratulated the Indian Adult Education Association (IAEA) for conferring the Nehru Literacy Award since 1968 and Tagore Literacy Award since 1987 to individuals and institutions that have made noteworthy contribution to the field of education and national development. Conferred in the name of two great sons of India, these awards will inspire millions of our countrymen in the years to come to do their best to serve humanity by lighting the lamp of knowledge, he said. He also congratulated the recipients of Nehru and Tagore

Literacy Awards – Prof. P. Adinarayana Reddy, Prof. M.C. Reddeppa Reddy, Dr. Anita Dighe and Smt. Nishat Farooq for their outstanding contribution to nation-building. Shri Naidu opined that modernization, urbanization, communication, commercialization, and digitalization, among other things, have become essential aspects of the world today and hence, individuals and institutions need to adapt themselves accordingly to sustain against this growing pressure.

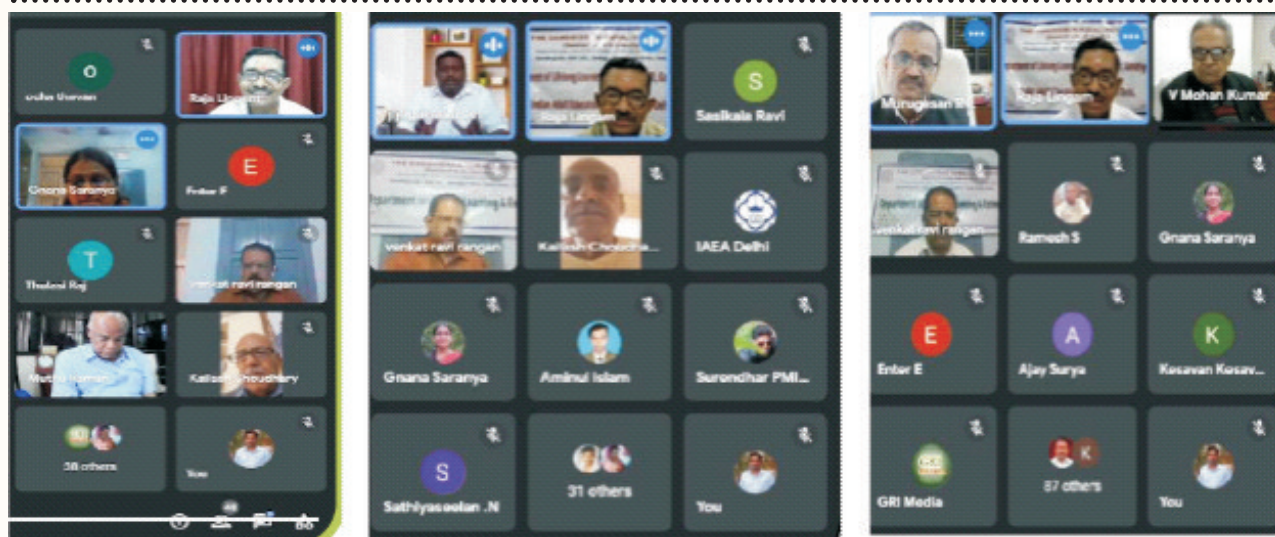


He said that the government with the motto of "sabka saath, sabka vikas, sabka vishwaas", is making every possible effort to eliminate illiteracy and poverty. The New Education Policy 2020 brings a paradigm shift in our education system. This has been developed to fulfil the aspirations of millions of citizens while realizing the Sustainable Development Goals-2030. Goal number four of SDG 2030 seeks to ensure "quality and inclusive education for all and to foster lifelong learning opportunities" which is also reflected in the New Education Policy 2020. He urged all stakeholders, including the private sector, to come forward and supplement the government's work in the field of adult education and skills training. We must go beyond simple literacy and focus our attention on increasing digital literacy and financial literacy among the masses. Shri Naidu made an appeal to every educated youth to come forward and teach at least one person from their localities or communities how to write, how to operate digital devices and how to avail benefits of government schemes. Like CSR - Corporate Social Responsibility, he requested every citizen to fulfil PSR i.e Personal Social Responsibility.

Working for the last 82 years, IAEA has played an important role in nation-building and he desired that the Association will continue to do so with the same dedication and firmness.

(vi) Special Lecture Series on the Role of HEIs in Extension and Community Outreach Programmes



The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), Gandhigram in collaboration with the Indian Adult Education Association, New Delhi jointly organized a three day Special Lecture Series in virtual mode from December 8-10, 2021 which was attended by a large number of scholars from across the country along with the faculty members.

II. Certificate Course in Library Science (CLS)

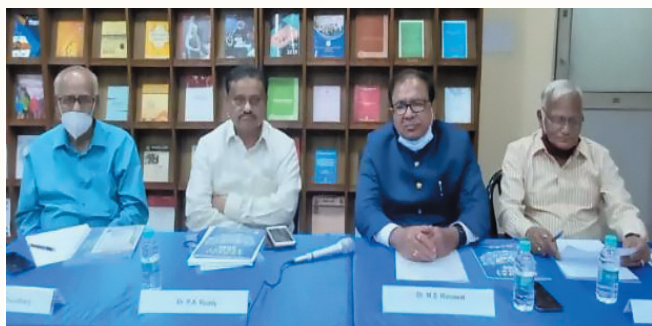
(i) Practical Examination conducted for CLS

III. Executive Committee Meetings

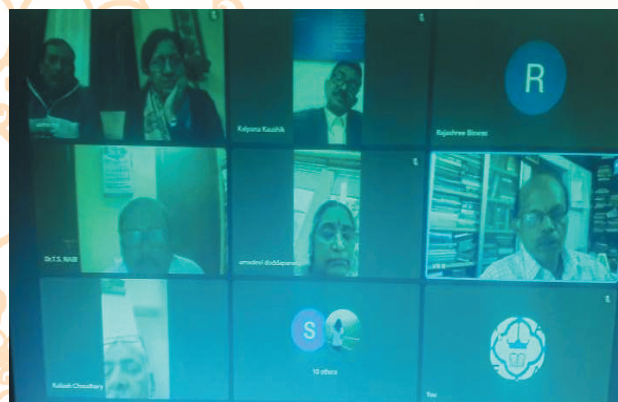


In the year 2021 the Executive Committee of IAEA met thrice respectively on March 19, 2021; July 17, 2021; and December 18, 2021, out of which two were in virtual mode.

The first meeting of the newly elected Executive Committee of IAEA was held on March 19, 2021 at its Headquarters in New Delhi which was presided over by Dr. M. S. Ranawat, President. The meeting was attended by 16 Members including Former President Shri K. C. Choudhary, General Secretary Shri Suresh Khandelwal, Special Invitee Prof. Asoke Bhattacharya and those 5 members who ensured their presence online. The meeting was facilitated by Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director and Shri M. L. Sharma, Deputy Director, IAEA. Formally began with welcoming the members by the President and the General Secretary, the EC confirmed the minutes of the previous meeting held online on November 3, 2020. IAEA publishes three periodicals out of which two are journals published biannually and one Newsletter published quarterly.

- (i) During the year of reporting **Indian Journal of Adult Education** was published twice – one issue 1 for the quarter January-June 2021 and the second issue 2 for the period July-December 2021.

Indian Journal of Adult Education is a peer reviewed one and also on the approved list of UGC-CARE Group D (117).

- (ii) In the year 2021 two issues of Proudh Shiksha were published one for the period January-June 2021 and another for July-December 2021.
- (iii) Four issues of **IAEA Newsletter** have been published in 2021 respectively for the period January-March 2021, April-June 2021, July-September 2021 and October – December 2021.

VII. Library and Documentation Centre

Library and Documentation Centre in IAEA is an important unit as it mostly caters to the academic needs of Post Graduate students and research scholars. It has a large number of books and documented issue based materials for reading and reference. This unit carried out the following activities:

(ii) Project received and completed

IAEA successfully conducted a “Survey on Skill Mapping in JJ Clusters in East Delhi” which was sanctioned by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi. The report was submitted in time. Consequently, it was approved by the Directorate and uploaded to its website for public viewing.

(iii) Skill Mapping Survey conducted in East Delhi

IAEA was assigned a study entitled “Survey on Skill Mapping in JJ Clusters in East Delhi” by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi on July 14, 2021 in which a total of 5060 households in 10 pre-identified JJ clusters of East Delhi were approached covering a population of 20,414. It was a real time app based study for which IAEA constituted a research team of 23 professionals and scholars having reliable understanding who interviewed a total of 12,104 individuals in 15-45 years age group.



Moving on an analytical approach the research team developed a detailed plan to complete the study well in time focussing on each and every step of the survey including training-cum-orientation of research team, pilot study, finalization of the questionnaire, development of web-based application, consultation with academicians and pre-testing of the questionnaire, standardization and validation of questionnaire, sample design, identification of location and area planning.

(a) Consultation with Academicians, Pre-testing and Finalization of the Questionnaire

The questionnaire developed for this study was thoroughly discussed at various levels. The preliminary discussion was held with the officials of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics and thereafter, with the experts associated with the IAEA. One consultation meeting was specifically organized at the Headquarters of IAEA on July 7,

2021 which was participated by Prof. (Dr.) S.Y. Shah, Former Head of the Department, Group of Adult Education, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi and Prof. Rajesh, Head, Department of Adult, Continuing Education & Extension, Faculty of Social Science, University of Delhi, Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, Shri B. Sanjoy, Research Officer and Shri Kripal Singh Mehra, Programme Associate.



(b) Training-cum-Orientation of Research Team



Prior to conducting the pilot study a Training-cum-Orientation for the team of professionals identified for executing the study was organized in two different spells. The first was an in-house Discussion-cum-Orientation held on July 16, 2021 in the Conference Hall of IAEA Headquarters, New Delhi and the other on July 22, 2021 at the Conference Hall, Vikas Bhawan-II, Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Govt. of NCT of Delhi conducted under the guidance of the officials of DES. In the training programme senior administrators, academicians and field functionaries including Shri C. K. Dutta, Joint Director, Shri Shah-E-Alam, Deputy Director, DES, Shri K. C. Choudhary, Former President, Prof. L. Raja, President, Shri Suresh Khandelwal, General Secretary, Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Incharge Director and Shri B. Sanjoy, Research Officer, IAEA shared their experiences with the participants.

(c) Pilot Study



The pilot study was conducted at Indira Camp, Kalyanvas, Khichripur on July 29,

2021 in order to have a pre-testing of the research instruments specifically the questionnaire, functioning of the web based application, responses of the target group and effectiveness of the outcome of the survey viz-a-viz the objectives laid down for this study.

(d) Ground Planning and Data Collection

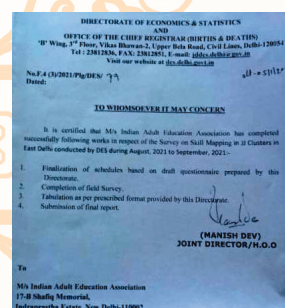
Eight different teams of field investigators each headed by a field supervisor were formed for detailed survey in order to complete it within the stipulated timeframe. Prior to conducting the survey a team of field supervisors along with coordinators had transect walk through all the locations for indentifying landmarks and area demarcation so that each household can be accessed without failure. They also had meetings with local leaders specifically Pradhans and representatives of Residents Welfare Associations, Anganwadis and other social organizations active in the area in order to establish rapport with the residents. Field supervisors briefed them well in advance



about the objectives of the study and requested them to motivate people in their neighborhood for extending cooperation towards the survey.

(e) Submission and Acceptance of the Report

The draft report was submitted to the Directorate of Economics and Statistics on September 17, 2021 which was accepted by competent authority in the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. Consequently the Completion Certificate was issued to the Association by DES. The report was also uploaded on the website of DES for public viewing.



(f) Media Coverage and Adoption of the outcomes of Report

Many prominent newspapers like The Times of India, The Indian Express and The Hindustan Times along with news agencies like PTI covered the outcomes of the report.

It was understood from the media that many of the outcomes of this report were adopted by the Government of NCT of Delhi which directed the concerned departments to work in the light of the findings of the report so that the people looking to enhancing their skills and abilities can acquire it smoothly at their doorstep and more job opportunities are created in due course to address the rising unemployment issue in the state. This was widely covered in print and electronic media as well.

Focus On Bringing Economy Back On Track, Says Sisodia

Holds Meeting With Officials To Assess Severe Covid Blow

New Delhi: With the state economy suffering heavy losses in the past two years due to Covid pandemic, deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia on Friday said efforts would be made to bring it back on track in the next financial year.

After a high-level review meeting with officials of the finance and planning department, Sisodia, who also holds the finance portfolio, said the focus would be on developing Delhi as a hub of business and services in 2022-23. The Kejriwal government

development, he added. The financial years of 2020-21 and 2021-22 have been quite bad for the state economy due to Covid-induced restrictions on various businesses. In 2020-21, there was a shortfall of 34% in the state's revenue collection, while in 2021-22, it is almost nonfunctional.

national economy in the first quarter. The revenue collection has been better in the current fiscal in comparison to the last one.

The AAP government had presented a budget of Rs 69,000 crore for the financial year of 2021-22, which was 16% higher than the revised estimates of 2020-21. The budget for 2022-23 is likely to go up further, said finance department officials.

After the review meeting, Sisodia said the Delhi budget would be special and would foster the economic growth of the national capital. He added that the planning department

had done a few studies and based on its findings, the government was trying to understand what innovative ways could be introduced to boost the capital's economy and increase job opportunities.

"The deputy CM further said that there would be focus on various schemes of public welfare, including education, health, electricity and clean drinking water, in the upcoming budget. "The necessities of all state residents will be kept in mind while preparing this year's budget, which will help them recover from the pandemic-led economic crisis," Sisodia said.

Over A Third Of Slum Dwellers Without Jobs

Half Of Households Spend Less Than ₹10K/Month

New Delhi: Over 30% of slum dwellers in Delhi are unemployed, according to a survey by the state government. The survey also found that 50% of households in slums spend less than ₹10,000 per month on household expenses, including food, rent, and utilities.

The survey was conducted by the state government's Department of Economic and Statistics, and was based on data collected from 100 slum households across the city.

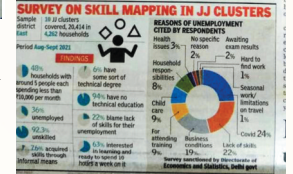
The findings of the survey are expected to be used by the government to plan and implement various schemes to improve the living conditions of slum dwellers.

XII. International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education (IIALE)

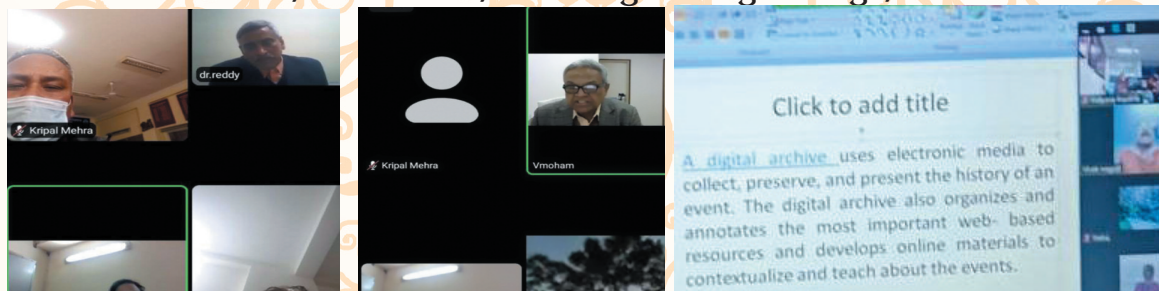
(i) Twelve day Workshop organized for IGNOU Students

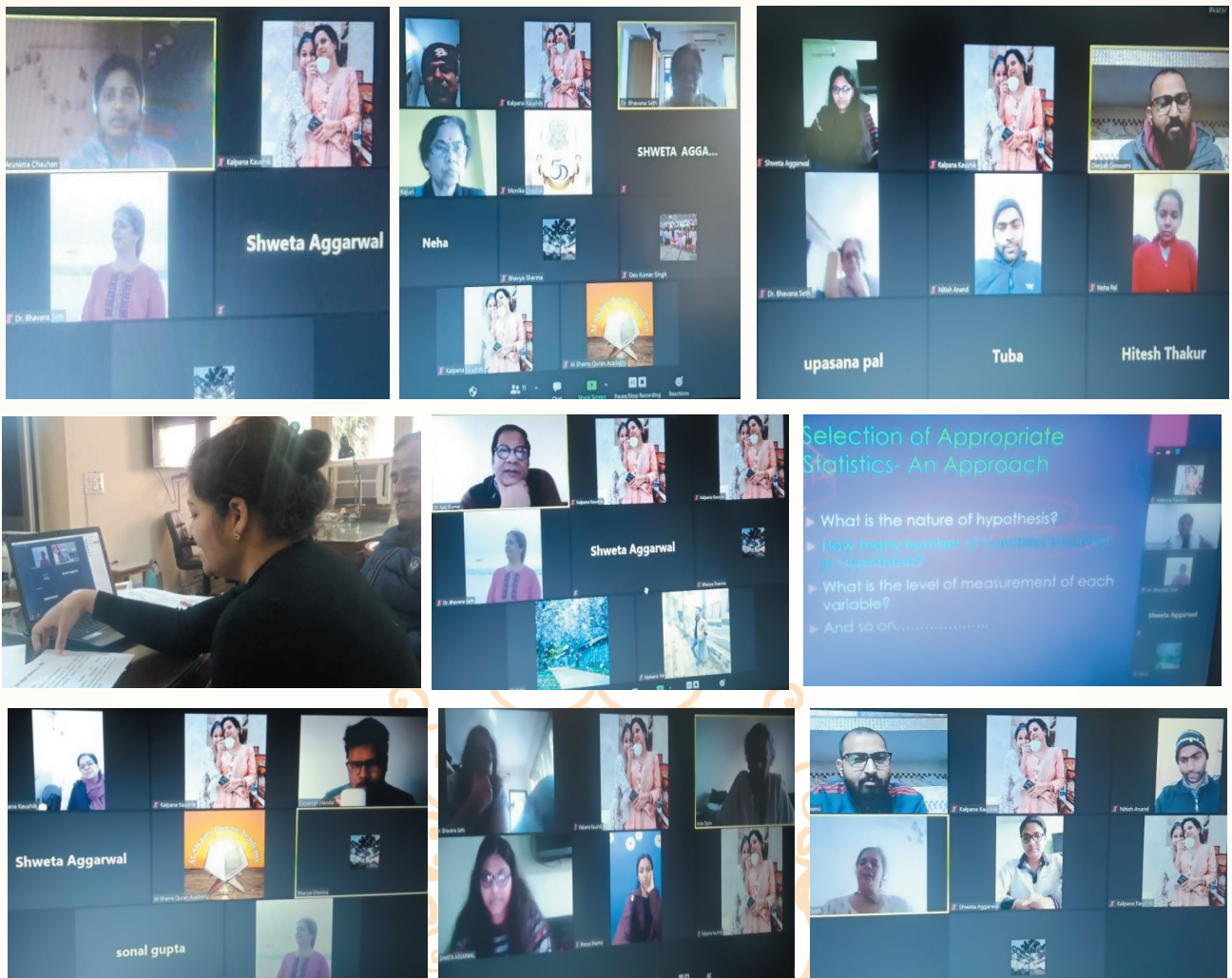
Two online workshops, each of 12 days long were organized by the IGNOU Study Centre 29049(P) under International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education for the first-year students of MAAE and PGDAE during the period of reporting.

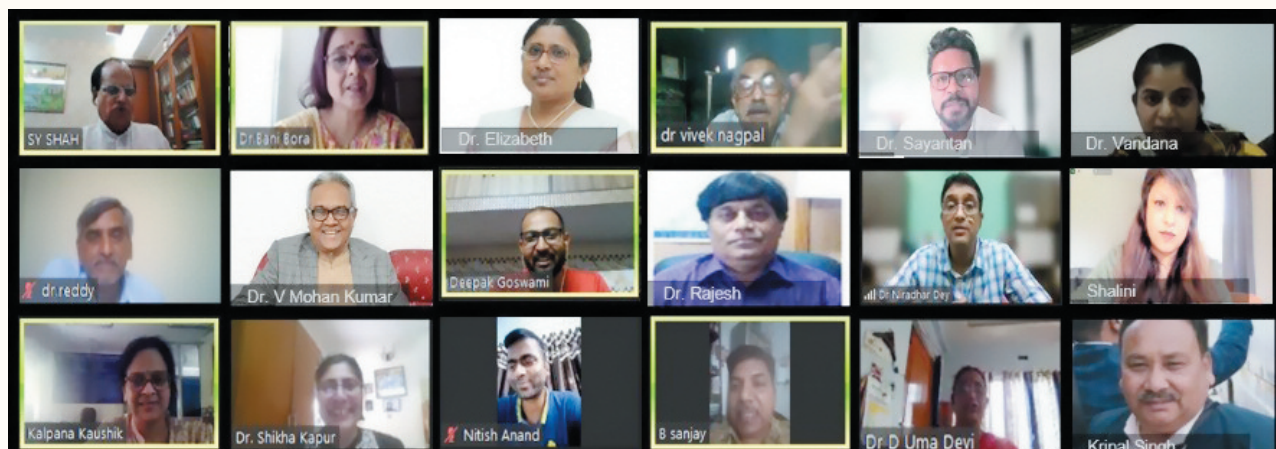

(ii) IGNOU Term End Examination

(a) Term End Examination December 2020

The December 2020 TEE of IGNOU started on February 8, 2021 and continued till March 13, 2021. A total of 5712 students were allocated to this centre out of which 4008 appeared for the examinations.



(b) Term End Examination June 2021

The June 2021 TEE started on August 3, 2021 and continued till September 9, 2021. A total of 3517 students were allocated to this centre out of which 2556 appeared for the examinations.

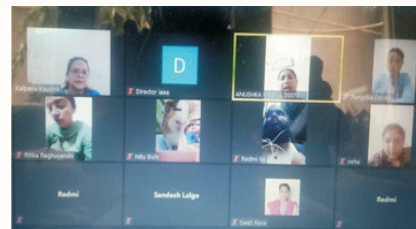

Kalpana Kaushik, Programme In-charge regarding the course curriculum and content, its timeline and the need for timely submission of the assignments so that they can complete the course within its timeframe. XIII. Obituary

Prof. M.G. Krishnan, former Director of Department of Adult Education, Bangalore University who subsequently became the Vice-Chancellor of Karnataka Open University passed away on December 19, 2020.



Dr. Shaibal Gupta, a recipient of the coveted Padma Shree Award (Posthumously) and founder of the Asian Development Research Institute (ADRI), Patna died of a chronic ailment on January 28, 2021. He was an eminent economist and a socio-political activist with a profound understanding of the cause of social and economic deprivation of the masses in Bihar.



Centenarian Shri Dwariko Sundarani, was a recipient of the prestigious Jamna Lal Bajaj Award who passed away on March 31, 2021 at his residence in Bodh Gaya, Bihar.



Dr. M.S. Ranawat, President, IAEA and Honorary Director, Natnagar Sodh Sansthan, Sitamau left this world for a heavily abode on April 10, 2021 while accomplishing routine work. His journey with IAEA started way back on March 11, 2000 when he became a Life Member of the Association. Thereafter, he started taking a keen interest in the affairs of IAEA. He was elected as Treasurer for the period 2008 to 2010 and Vice President for the period 2011-2020. For a short stint (2019-20) he also served as In-charge President of the Association. In 2021 he was formally elected as the President of IAEA for the period of 2021-24. His sudden demise created a vacuum in the field of adult education in general and for IAEA in particular.



Professor H.S. Bhola, was one of the renowned scholars in the field of Adult Education who passed away at his home in Indiana (USA) on April 9, 2021. He was closely associated with the Indian Adult Education Association and took a keen interest in the activities of IAEA and served as a Distinguished Professor at the International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education, New Delhi during 2002-2021. In view of his manifold contributions to the field of Adult Education, IAEA honoured him with Nehru Literacy Award in 2013.



Shri Avik Ghosh, died peacefully in his sleep on April 13, 2021 at his home on the banks of the Ganges near Rishikesh.



Shri Nutnesh Chandra Pant, was an Advocate and a known social activist who died on April 21, 2021. He was the Life Member of IAEA since October 19, 1978. He also served IAEA as Joint Secretary for a considerable period and got elected as its Treasurer for the period 2005-2008.



Shri Ambarish Rai, was a well known social activist who died on May 28, 2021 at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Hospital in South Delhi due to Covid-19. He will be always missed by his friends and activists in the academic fraternity.



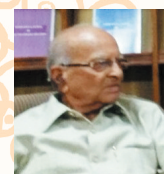

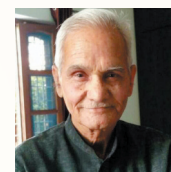
