

Global Education Monitoring Report Team. Global education monitoring report 2022: gender report, deepening the debate on those still left behind. France, United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization; 2022: 70 p.

The 2022 Gender Report presents progress towards gender parity in education with respect to access, attainment and learning. It showcases the results of a new model that provide logical estimates, combining multiple sources of information, on completion rates. It also reviews the results of learning assessments released over the past 18 months, which present an almost global picture of the gender gap in reading, mathematics and science achievement in lower and upper primary and lower secondary grades.

It emphasizes the role of non-state actors in influencing gender inequality in and through education. Non-state actors have filled in provision gaps left by the public education system. The Report presents evidence on gender gaps in the share of students enrolled in private institutions by sex and what drives these gaps in the various regions. It also provides case studies on the privatization of childcare in high-income countries, the impact of non-state faith-based schools in Asia on gender norms and the role of women's universities around the

Ministry of Education. National Achievement Survey 2021. New Delhi, Government of India, Department of School Education & Literacy, 2021: 27p.

National Achievement Survey (NAS) 2021 is a nationally representative large-scale survey of students' learning. The survey gives a system-level reflection on the effectiveness of school education. It enables States and the Union Territories to identify gaps in learning outcomes and take remedial steps and also helps in the capacity building for teachers and officials involved in the delivery of education in the country.

Key points of the report:

- NAS 2021 conducted 2021 assessed over 34 lakh students in 1.18 lakh schools at 720 districts across 36 states and Union Territories.
- NAS assesses the health of the school education system in the country by conducting a comprehensive evaluation survey of children's learning competencies at Classes 3, 5, 8 and 10 with a cycle period of three years. It reflects the overall assessment of the school education

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system. The last NAS was held in 2017.

- NAS 2021 covered both central and state government schools, government-aided schools and private schools across the country.
- The survey was conducted in 22 languages in Language, Mathematics and EVS for Class 3 and 5; Language, Mathematics, Science and Social Science for Class 8 and Language, Mathematics, Science, Social Science and English for Class 10.
- The report is based on the performance in all subjects through disaggregation by gender (female, male), Area (Rural and Urban), Management of schools (Government, Government aided and Private unaided) and Social Groups (Schedule Caste (SC), Schedule Tribe (ST), Other Backward Communities (OBC) and General.

The survey finds that the national average percentage, the average of scores across four subjects, for Class 3 is 59%, which declines by 10 percentage points to 49% in Class 5. It further drops to 41.9% in Class 8 and 37.8% in Class 10. In all subjects, average scores are lower than 2017. The average performance of schools in rural areas is "significantly below" those in urban areas in the same regions, and the performance of students from scheduled caste (SC), scheduled tribe (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) categories is much lower than that of students from the general category.

Talukdar, Sougata. Right to Health in India: Law, Policy and Practice. New Delhi, Sage, 2022: 322 p.

Health and human rights are complementary to each other in advancing progress and social justice. Right to Health in India: Law, Policy and Practice examine the fundamental right to health in light of the contemporary human rights discourse. It advocates for a rights-based approach to health that acknowledges the socioeconomic dimensions and implications of access to health and dignity of life.

This book studies the legislative and policy initiatives designed to protect women, children, HIV/AIDS patients, workers, people with disabilities and all Indian citizens from health hazards and medical malpractice. It explores the constitutional mandates and safeguards regarding right to health in India. The book further discusses the international legal framework on health, analysing it along with the developments in Indian health law. It critically examines the role played by implementing authorities and judiciary in determining the access to and success of right to health in India.





#### **Dissertation Work**





#### **Veteran Statistician Shri Prem Chand is no more**

A well known Statistician, Evaluator and Adult Educationist Shri Prem Chand took his last breath at his residence in New Delhi on April 3, 2022. Fit and fine even at the age of 88, he was quite involved in writing analytical notes, interpretations and research papers on data related to



various developmental yardsticks released by the Govt. of India and other prominent international agencies. He authored four widely referred books in the field of literacy, population education and development statistics out of which two - "Statistical Database for Literacy 2001 by Rural and Urban Areas" and "Status and Trend of Literacy in India (Adult and Youth) Database for Literacy Programmes 2011" were sponsored by the Indian Adult Education Association, New Delhi. Under his leadership more than 60 evaluation projects assigned by government departments/agencies were successfully accomplished by IAEA across the country.

Shri Prem Chand got associated with IAEA in 1995 when he formally became a Life Member of the Association. His departure has created a void in statistical interpretation of the outcomes of literacy movement in India which will certainly be felt by scholars and academicians in the post 2021 census period. We in IAEA express our sincere homage and pray to the Almighty to give eternal peace to the liberated soul.



Manimegalai Director & Head, Department of Women's Studies, Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirapalli and Dr. Varsha Das, Former Chief Editor & Joint Director, National Book Trust, New Delhi delivered special lectures on the theme "Gender Equality today for a Sustainable Tomorrow" which was decided on the line of UN Theme for International Women's Day 2022. Hosted on Google Meet this webinar was attended by more than 400 scholars and experts through YouTube platform.

The proceedings of the first day of the webinar began with the welcome address delivered by Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, Indian Adult Education Association, New Delhi followed by the Presidential Address delivered by Dr. S. Balasundari, Associate Professor and Member, Board of Management, School




of English and Foreign Language, GRI. Dr. Balasundari outlined the vital role played by women in the societal development throughout the span of human civilization. On the first day two special lectures were delivered respectively by Dr. Kezevino Aram and Dr. Antara Ray. Speaking precisely on the topic "Can Gender Equality be a Shared Aspiration for Women and Men in the 21st Century? The Role of Evidences, Experiences and Ethics", Dr. Kezevino highlighted some of the major challenges to inclusive development of women in Indian society. She emphasized the need to redefine cultural notions and ethics in order to bridge the gender gap so that the younger generation is able to fulfill their aspirations in a sustained manner. While delivering her lecture on "Women, Political Participation and

Thereafter, Dr. S. S. Vijayanchalli, Professor and Director in-charge, Centre for Women Studies, GRI, delivered the presidential address. Dr. Vijayanchalli attempted to draw a comparative picture of women's empowerment during post and pre-independence period. Underlining the reasons behind





persisting gender inequalities she emphasized the need to develop a pro women mindset in the society. Dr. Manimekalai spoke on the topic of "Economic Participation of women as a key to Sustainable Development". She highlighted the impact of pandemic on women's employment and desired to equip them with technical knowhow and skill training. Dr. Varsha wanted women to play a much bigger political role for their own empowerment. Narrating Mahatma Gandhi's experience of South Africa she desired women in the country to get involved in the process of decision making at every possible level whether it be at home or in society.

### **Outreach Activity as part of Centenary Year Celebration Programme of DU**



On May 1, 2022, University of Delhi completed 100 years of its establishment. As part of the Centenary Year Celebration Programmes of the University, a group of scholars from the Department of Adult, Continuing Education and Extension (DACEE) visited Anna Nagar slum area located nearby ITO, New Delhi on May 10, 2022, and had fruitful interaction with the residents. This outreach activity was intended to promote university-community interface and provide the scholars with an opportunity to gain firsthand experience and insight into community work.





Under the supervision of Prof. Rajesh, Head, DACEE a total of 18 students and scholars from the department took part in this outreach activity which was broadly divided into two parts. In the first part, all the visiting scholars watched a documentary film on IAEA followed by an interaction-cum-question answer session with Dr. S.Y.Shah, Honorary Director, International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education; Prof. Rajesh and Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, In-charge Director, IAEA. In the second part they visited the slum area of Anna Nagar which has been adopted by the Committee on Education, University of Delhi, under its Institutional Social Responsibility and had one to one interaction with 48 residents mostly the women and children.

The motive behind this community outreach activity is to assess the need of the community in relation to digital literacy, financial literacy, basic and foundational literacy, and to know whether the active community members are willing to volunteer themselves for the developmental activities being conducted by the Association. Hence, opinion was solicited through a questionnaire prepared in the form of "Google – form". All the participating students and scholars got divided into groups having 4-5 members each for conducting this door to door campaign in which they tried to create awareness regarding health and hygiene, the importance of using sanitary pads during menstruation cycle and acquiring skills for their economic well being.
