

ASER Centre. Annual Status of Education Report (Rural) 2022 (Provisional). New Delhi, ASER Centre, 2023: 348p.

ASER is a household survey conducted across 616 rural districts and covers 6.9 lakh children in the age group of 3 to 16 years to record their schooling status and assess their basic reading and arithmetic skills. The percentage of children in Class 3 in government or private schools who were able to read at the level of Class 2 dropped from 27.3% in 2018 to 20.5% in 2022. This decline is visible in every State, and for children in both government and private schools.

States showing a decline of more than 10 percent points from 2018 levels include those that had higher reading levels in 2018, such as Kerala (from 52.1% in 2018 to 38.7% in 2022), Himachal Pradesh (from 47.7% to 28.4%), and Haryana (from 46.4% to 31.5%). Large drops are also visible in Andhra Pradesh (from 22.6% to 10.3%) and Telangana (from 18.1% to 5.2%).

Nationally, the proportion of children enrolled in Class 5 in government or private schools who can at least read a Class 2-level text fell from 50.5% in 2018 to 42.8% in 2022. States showing a decrease of 15 percentage points or more include Andhra Pradesh (from 59.7% in 2018 to 36.3% in 2022), Gujarat (from 53.8% to 34.2%), and Himachal Pradesh (from 76.9% to 61.3%).

The drops in basic reading ability are smaller for Class 8 students, where 69.6% of children enrolled in government or private schools who could read at least basic text in 2022 falling from 73% in 2018. The ASER reading test assesses whether a child can read letters, words, a simple paragraph at Class 1 level of difficulty, or a story at Class 2 level of difficulty.

Class 3 students who were able to do at least subtract dropped from 28.2% in 2018 to 25.9% in 2022. While Jammu & Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh maintained or improved slightly over 2018 levels, steep drops of more than 10 percentage points are visible in Tamil Nadu. The proportion of children in Class 5 across India who can carry out division has also fallen slightly from 27.9% in 2018 to 25.6% in 2022.

The performance of Class 8 students in basic arithmetic is more varied. Nationally, the proportion of children who can do division has increased slightly, from 44.1% in 2018 to 44.7% in 2022. This increase is driven by improved outcomes among girls as well as among children enrolled in government schools, whereas boys and children enrolled in private schools show a decline over 2018 levels. Children in Class 8 in government schools did significantly better in 2022 than in 2018 in Uttar Pradesh (from 32% to 41.8%) and Chhattisgarh (from 28% to 38.6%), but were significantly worse off in Punjab (from 58.4% to 44.5%).

While, families withdrew students from private schools to save money spent on tuition fees, they also invested in private tuition classes, which increased as the proportion of such students rose further from 26.4% in 2018 to 30.5% in 2022 in both private and government schools. This may also be the reason why learning gaps are sharper in reading because students typically choose to study

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maths and science in tuition classes.

The report also lays to rest concern about the pandemic forcing families to withdraw girls from schools and force them into early marriages. It finds that the percentage of girls in the age group of 11-14 years who were out of school declined to 2% from 4.1%. The decrease in the proportion of girls not enrolled in school is even sharper among older girls in the 15-16 years age group, which stood at 7.9% in 2022 as compared with 13.5% in 2018. Government schools have seen a sharp increase in children enrolled from 65.6% in 2018 to 72.9% in 2022, reversing another trend of a steady decrease in student enrolments seen since 2006, when it was at 73.4%.

HelpAge India. Bridge the Gap: Understanding Elder Needs - A HelpAge India 2022 Report. HelpAge India; 2022: 40 p.

This report explores the current perceptions, realities and aspirations of the older persons and their care givers vis a vis gainful employment, volunteering, health care, safety and security, inclusion in family and society and the new age fact of digital world. The data from 22 cities in India for both elderly (defined as 60+ years of age) and caregivers (adult caregivers- 16 to 55 years of age living with the elderly) has been collected to investigate socioeconomic, demographic, livelihood opportunities and willingness, abuse, health, and factors related to social connections. SALIENT FINDINGS

- · 47% of the elderly are dependent on family support as their source of income, and 34% depend on pensions. 21% of the elderly are still working and earning.
- 60% of the elderly feel financially secure, and 76% of them feel so because of the family support.
- 57% feel financially insecure because of their expenses exceeding their savings or income. 45% reported inadequacy of pensions and 38% reported lack of employment opportunities as their reasons for financial insecurity. Of those working, 56% find their employment environment conducive.
- 36% of elderly are willing to work among which 40% are willing to work as long as possible.
- 58% of care-givers, compared to 39% of elderly, are of the view that employment opportunities are available for the elderly.
- 56% of caregivers want their elderly relative to be employed. 30% elderly are willing to volunteer and contribute to the society.
- 87% of the elderly reported having health facilities available, but only 52% could access those.
- 67% of elderly do not have any health insurance. Better health insurance, and better health facilities nearby are the top two suggestions shared by both elderly & caregivers to improve the system. Free medical treatment facilities for the elderly were also suggested by a majority of care-givers.

31% of the elderly have fear of getting hurt in the locality due to frailty and bad infrastructure.

## International Seminar on Professionalization of Adult & LLL at New Delhi



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Extension, University of Delhi in collaboration with the huge Indian Adult Education Association, New Delhi organized a Shri Choudhary said that under the umbrella of IAEA, three days International Seminar on "Professionalization of Adult Education and Lifelong Learning in Indian Universities under New India Literacy Programme (2022-2027) and National Education Policy 2020" from January 4-6, 2023. The second part which was held on January 6, 2023 was primarily focused on providing a comprehensive knowledge about the functioning of IAEA as a premier civil society organization working continuously for last 83 years in the wider domain of adult and lifelong education both at national and international forum. The programme was participated by more than 60 academicians and scholars coming together from across the country and many other nations.

The programme here began with the welcome address given by Prof. L. Raja, President, IAEA & Head, Department ALADIN (the Adult Learning Documentation and of Lifelong Education, GRI, Tamil Nadu followed by a brief remarks on "Challenges before the Professionalization of Adult & LLL" by Shri K.C. Choudhary, Chancellor, International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education, IAEA. The Keynote Address was delivered by Prof. N. K. Ambasht, Visitor, IIALE while Prof. S.Y.Shah, Director, IIALE and former Head, Group of Adult Education, School of Social Sciences, JNU enlightened the scholars on issues related to the professionalization of adult and lifelong government has ruled out compartmentalization and learning in global perspective. Thereafter, Prof. Soren Ehlers, Associate Professor, Danish School of Education, Aarhus University, Denmark and Smt. Sunita Singh Chauhan, Advisor, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India shared their opinion about the context, crisis and initiatives to be taken to accelerate the process of professionalization of AE and LLL. The deliberation was concluded with an open session where a number of scholars raised issues of concern, queries and got their doubts clear.

Prof. Raja in his welcome speech requested everybody to start their daily journey with a fresh look towards the society where in they appreciate the positivity enshrined in every individual being. Referring to the long journey of IAEA he said working for the cause of adult population needs a

The Department of Adult, Continuing Education and special attitude and training in and ragogy and IAEA has a resource base for the same. scholars and activists in the era of seventies and eighties did a lot to evolve adult education as an independent discipline of higher learning. A result of which more than 180 universities opened separate Department of Adult and Lifelong Learning. However, the list has come down to 40 only posing a survival threat to new scholars pursuing their research work in the field. He advised to deep delve and find out what ails these departments and why did they failed to deliver. In his keynote address Prof. Ambasht highlighted the need to understand the basic difference between the process of adult learning and the way children learn. To him even the university teachers also need an exposure about the process of adult learning or andragogy. Recalling the history of struggle of IAEA Prof. Shah said in past atleast three major attempts have already been made towards professionalization of adult education at global level - EU Masters Degree Programme in Adult Learning and Information Network) and PALDIN (Participatory Adult Learning, Documentation and Information Networking) were a few exemplary achievements. He told that the domain of AE and LLL is facing a new challenge as financial allocation by the government to this sector has reached to its lowest ebb. Prof. Soren Ehlers said that the phenomenon is not new to India only even country like Denmark is too walking on the same track where looking for an integrated journey. Smt. Sunita Singh Chauhan, Advisor, Ministry of Education narrated the latest developments going on towards the implementation of "New India Literacy Programme (NILP)". She said that away from all odds, machinery at place, is trying hard to achieve the target in time.
